400	Everyday Academic English	Everyday English interaction knowledge and skills plus: basic plus academic language learning strategies and skills development.
500	Introduction to Academic English	Introduction to academic English language, skills, and cultural expectations using materials that are ESL simulations of authentic academic materials.
